In the following weeks, our primary focus will be planning for the Big Conversation event in March, where we will launch our directory alongside Headstart and other mental health charities. KYCC Elections 6th—19th November 2017

The recent annual Kent Youth County Council elections took place from 6th—19th November across the county in secondary schools and youth organisations. During the fortnight 21,734 young people voted. The ballot papers gave every voter an opportunity to vote for a young person standing to be members of KYCC within their district and an opportunity to vote for a youth related issue or topic that KYCC will work on in the forthcoming year on the other side. Voting was open to all young people living or being educated in Kent between 11 –19 years old.



72 young people were elected on to the Kent Youth County Council across the 12 districts of Kent and their first meeting was held at County Hall, Maidstone on 10th December. Many of these new members will attend a residential in mid January at the Swattenden Centre to learn more about the work of KYCC, work on the new campaigns and develop team working skills with other members.

The 3 top issues that were voted for have become this years KYCC campaign topics these are Anti-bullying, Curriculum for Life and Mental Health.

British Youth Council — House of Commons event

On the 10th November the Kent members of the UK Youth Parliament had the opportunity to sit on the green benches in the House of Commons and this was a the biggest privilege of my life so far, during the day we debated the five topics chosen by 1,000,000 young people across the UK. John Bercow Speaker for the house of Commons chaired the debates. The day was absolutely amazing and I would highly recommend this to anyone interested in politics or passionate about getting young voices heard.
