Our Children's social care is now rated 'good' by Ofsted.





More schools are now rated good or outstanding by Ofsted.





More 16 to 18 year olds are in education, employment or training.





We supported 11,000 families, including 24,000 children and young people, who needed our help.



We provided 67,000 health visits for children under 5 years old and their families.

We want everyone to be healthy and enjoy life



There were 1.65 million visitors to our country parks.





There were almost 17,000 visits to libraries per day.



We fixed over 9,000 potholes to make our roads better. An additional 1,200 potholes were fixed as part of the 'pothole blitz'.



We have increased the amount of waste not going into landfill to 719,363 tonnes (98% of all waste).



We converted over 63,000 streetlights to LED.



We created or protected 869 jobs with help from the Regional Growth Fund.



We have secured £3.4 million of funding to help pay for environmental schemes.

More people were given a 'Blue Badge' to help park nearer their destination if they are disabled.





Over 12,000 people had a personal budget to choose their own care and support.



Most people could live at home after support from enablement services. This is support which makes you feel safe and happy in your own home.





More carers found it easy to find information and advice about support and services.





We helped almost 1,500 people who could not visit a library by bringing books to their home.



We built more extra care housing for people who need housing with care and support.

Our relationships with residents and partners are important. We want to work together to make life better for people in Kent.
