Every library has at least five volunteering roles, with many more offered in most locations.

Hundreds of volunteers are involved with Time2Give every year around the county, like lan, who has been volunteering for 12 years.

What will I be doing?

We offer you a wide range of opportunities to help enhance our library service. No specific experience is needed for most activities, and we work with you to match your free time with the needs of your local library.

Opportunities include:

- selecting and delivering books to our customers, including carers
- helping customers overcome a range of IT issues including accessing computers, carrying out general internet queries, researching family history, searching for jobs online and other problems
- helping staff with rhymes and songs for pre-school children
- supporting us in developing more information and resources about the people and history of Kent
- planting reading and ceremony gardens

Our volunteers do not replace staff, so you will not be asked to issue, discharge or shelve books; teach reading; read stories to children or deal with customers' enquiries.

Be an IT Buddy

Volunteers with good computer skills are customers' IT Buddies. They help access computers, assist with IT problems and show people how to set up an email account or use the internet. IT Buddies patiently share their skills and experience giving people confidence with computers. Some IT Buddies help with online family history or job research, or with other more specialist IT.

Help with family events

You could help with a range of family events. Early Years Activities Hosts welcome people to regular rhyme singing sessions, chatting with families and offering refreshments. After School Activities Hosts support lively homework clubs, and are a popular service volunteering for young people taking the DofE award and other youth schemes.

Discover Kent's history

Volunteers local to Kent's History Centre help develop collections and research past events. Elsewhere in the county, volunteers help maintain and develop local history collections and resources.

You can give practical help

Volunteer gardeners help add colour to our library environment, creating reading gardens and outside facilities for storytime or poetry sessions.

Others share skills and interests in knitting and other crafts, or scrabble and chess. Our Talk Time hosts welcome groups of library customers for a coffee and chat, adding an extra dimension to a visit to the library.

Deliver books to people who cannot get to a library

We provide a free Home Library Service for anyone unable to visit the library due to ill health or disability, or because they are a carer. Volunteers help select books and deliver this service.

You visit people in their own homes and take a variety of library materials including books and spoken word CDs. You will need to be able to carry these materials.


