

KYCC Meeting Summary – April 2016

Announcements / Presentations

Feedback from meeting with KCC Cabinet members

- On Wednesday 13th April, the Chairs and Vice Chairs of KYCC campaign groups met with Members of the Kent County Council Cabinet to discuss youth-related issues. Paul Carter, Leader of Kent County Council, Roger Gough (Member for Education & Health Reform), Mike Hill (Member for Community Services), Matthew Balfour (Member for Transport and the Environment) and Graham Gibbens (Cabinet Member for Adult Social Care and Public Health).
- We discussed issues ranging from the cost of bus passes to the environment, the curriculum and young voter engagement. In addition, the present KCC members were supportive of the KYCC move to establish a KYCC Cabinet and welcomed moves for the youth council and adult council to work together on more inter-related issues.
- We will also be planning future events for KYCC Members to meet with their local KCC Members and organise some events during Local Democracy Week in October.

Campaign updates

Anti-bullying: Attended by 13 member

- Discussions about the content and style of anti-bullying resource boxes for secondary schools were discussed
- Stereotyping group developed ideas for posters and 2 designs finalised but identified that more research was needed for the info for the booklets
- Video group looked at ideas on format and decided on aims and actions for next meeting.
- Branding group finalised colours and costings for anti-bullying resources and now need to research funding options and apply

Curriculum for life: attended by 34 members

- Presentation notes for quality standard for RSE handed out
- Decided on questions for schools survey
- Planned action points and aims for next meeting
- Political group – decided on chapters to be covered and drafts for content to be ready by next meeting
- Finance group – Identified 4 keys areas needed to cover and delegated out to 4 members with breakdown of what to include.

Transport: attended by 11 members

- 5 step action plan was outlined as to future progress
- Theo updated group on post 16 transport policy
- Joe spoke to group about “don’t litter” and “respect” posters and groups fed back about their thoughts
- Kyle & Oliver delegated task to write letters to schools
- Joe showed group a cycling powerpoint and Z cards
- Still awaiting funding bid
