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Introduction

Thank you for picking up this copy of the **Kent Youth County Council Mental Health Support Services Directory!**

In this booklet, we will detail the main services which are available for **young people up to the age** of 25 in Kent, ordered by district.

In our 2015 study we found that in Kent,

45% of teachers have not had sufficient training

70% of students could not define 'mental health'

95% of students said there was not enough information available

85% of students want education on mental health

These statistics, among others which have been collected nationally, shocked us and encouraged us to produce materials which could be used by both students and teachers to help educate both about mental health and help to reduce the stigma which surrounds it.

The campaign worked with the *British Youth Council* to produce its 2015 *Youth Select Committee* Report into mental health and has since then come up with its own action plan on mental health:

- Due to the lack of education, the stigma around mental health is likely to continue to be prevalent until services are more readily and visibly available
- Bullying will not stop until young people understand what 'mental health' means and they understand the effects that it has in people's lives something not taught today
- Students do not have the required level of education provided to them in schools, so mental health should become compulsory on the PSHE curriculum and as training to teachers
- Most students would not know where to get help due to there not being enough information on mental health services for young people, this should be more readily available
- Making information more accessible, and involving more young people in education about mental health can help to remove the stigma around it

As a council, we have produced this booklet alongside lesson plans and presentations to aid teachers in producing lessons which make sense, are engaging and education on mental health. These can be accessed online at kent.gov.uk/kycc.







I have been at school for 5 years and have been lectured on the subject once or twice. Mental health is very common among people my age as I know this myself, I would really benefit from learning more on the matter, giving people the opportunity to help themselves out of these circumstances."


