Kent Support and Assistance Service

KCC has received a short term, one-off contribution from central government to support households experiencing financial hardship as a result of Covid-19. Using this grant, KCC can support those struggling to afford food and other essentials over the coming months due to the pandemic via our Kent Support and Assistance Service (KSAS).

We have all witnessed the impact Covid-19 has had on those nearest and dearest to us, as well as our peers, customers and communities that we work and connect with every day.

KSAS is here to help those facing hardship as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic perhaps due to being furloughed at work, losing hours of employment or pay, or even being made redundant. KSAS is aiming to support households experiencing these difficulties by providing short term support with items such food or energy vouchers, help with school clothing or household items. Sudden Bereavement Service

Sudden is a free service for bereaved people protecting their emotional and physical wellbeing from day one, and for the first ten weeks, at a time of shock and loss in cases when someone has died suddenly or too soon.

Sudden is part-funded by the Department of Health and Social Care. It is a crisis

response to COVID-19 but is here for the long term. It is receiving very positive feedback from users, and is run by a professional sudden bereavement team, within an established charity (Brake, which operates the National Road Victim Service for road crash victims).
