MULTI-AGENCY SAFEGUARDING ADULTS WORKSHOP: SECTION 42 CARE ACT 2014 – POLICIES, PROCEDURES AND AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES

The training has been agreed and is commissioned by the Kent and Medway Safeguarding Adults Board, and is developed as part of an integrated programme of development for staff from statutory partner agencies. Each agency provides its own introductory safeguarding adults training, as well as other associated learning.

This course is primarily for those staff with responsibility for direct practice in safeguarding and who are likely to be involved with Safeguarding Enquiries. As safeguarding is integral to all work, it is important that delegates who attend the course have the agreement and support of their line manager.

Delegates wishing to book a place should ensure the training is appropriate for their role and contact their agency's lead for learning and development in the first instance.

The training comprises:

Pre-reading, followed by one whole-day face-to-face workshop

(It is a pre-requisite for attendance on the course that you read the pre-course material, which will be e-mailed to you in advance)

All staff directly involved with contributing to, and cooperating with, Section 42 enquiries under the Care Act, 2014, as well as those with a specific role in making enquiries and managing the process.

- Understanding of the responsibilities of specific agencies and key roles within those agencies - including Information Governance
- The different response levels and enquiry options
- Thresholds and pathways for safeguarding and other concerns
- Methods of enquiry
- Understanding of broader risk management, including contractual and poor performance sanctions
