#### Adverse Weather - Yellow Cold-Health Alert

A Yellow Cold-Health Alert has been issued for our region with effect until Tuesday **5 December 2023**.

Please ensure that Cold-Health Alert - Yellow Response Actions are implemented now.

Significant impacts are <u>possible</u> across the health and social care sector due to forecast weather conditions, including:

- observed increase in mortality across the population, particularly in the 65+ age group or those with certain underlying health conditions, but impacts may also be seen in younger age groups;
- increased demand for remote health care services likely;
- impact on ability of services delivered due to effects on workforce possible;
- maintaining indoor temperatures at recommended 18°c may become challenging for some, leading to increased risk to vulnerable people.

## Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC)

As you may be aware, the failure of RAAC components has been identified as a risk in some buildings. RAAC is a form of lightweight concrete sometimes referred to as panels; it was used primarily in roof planks of some public buildings built between the mid-1950s and mid-1990s.

The safety of clients should be the highest priority of every social care provider, whether a premises used for the delivery of services is owned or leased. All providers are required to have a good understanding of their premises, including building safety issues; this includes whether the premises contain RAAC components, and therefore poses a risk to the safety of all those who have access.

Please ensure that you have taken all necessary action to establish whether your premises contains RAAC. If your organisation leases the premises you operate from, please discuss this with your landlord.

### Funding has increased for International Recruitment

Due to unprecedented demand, two £1500 grants per care service are now available meaning providers can:



- access up to £3,000 towards their international recruitment CARE ALLIANCE

  costs!
- Providers who have previously received a £1,500 grant are now invited to apply for a second grant.

#### Please see details below:

The government has made funding available to support international recruitment into the social care sector during the 23-24 financial year.

In order to be eligible for a grant, a provider must meet the following criteria:

- Be registered with the CQC as a provider of social care
- Be located (determined by registered CQC location) in one of the Local Authority areas in the South East region
- Have an overall CQC rating which is above the 'Inadequate' rating at the time of application (i.e. 'Outstanding', 'Good' or 'Requires Improvement')
- EITHER intend to apply for a Licence to Sponsor skilled workers OR to hold a
  licence already and intend to recruit at least one international worker on a Skilled
  Worker Visa between 1 April 2023 and 15 March 2024
- Confirm that they will understand and will abide by the provisions of the Ethical Recruitment Framework (See the Code of Practice: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/code-of-practice-for-the-international-recruitment-of-health-and-social-care-personnel/code-of-practice-for-the-international-recruitment-of-health-and-social-care-personnel-in-england">https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/code-of-practice-for-the-international-recruitment-of-health-and-social-care-personnel-in-england</a>)
- Confirm that they are able to offer any international workers they recruit work in accordance with the requirements of the Skilled Worker Visa
- Correctly and fully complete the correct application form.

A provider's eligibility will be assessed at the time of application. Each must apply to the hub for the local authority whose area includes that location. For Kent and Medway, this is the Kent Integrated Care Alliance (KiCA).

Providers do not need to have applied for a licence or recruited a skilled worker in order to

apply for a grant, however they will have to provide evidence that their licence has been awarded or that they have employed a new skilled worker **between 1 April 2023 and 15 March 2024** before a grant will be paid to them.

The <u>application</u> is for providers included in the **Kent and Medway Council Districts.** Please ensure it is completed in its entirety, double check all details are correct, and do not hesitate to contact <u>recruitment@kica.care</u> or <u>grants@sesca.org.uk</u> if you have any concerns or queries.
