

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (the "Authority")

Issue of audit opinion on the financial statements

In our audit report for the year ended 31 March 2017 issued on 27 July 2017 we reported that, in our opinion:

- the financial statements present a true and fair view of the financial position of the Authority as at 31 March 2017 and of its expenditure and income for the year then ended; and
- the financial statements have been properly prepared in accordance with the CIPFA/LASAAC Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016-17 and applicable law.

Issue of audit opinion on the pension fund financial statements

In our audit report for the year ended 31 March 2017 issued on 27 July 2017 we reported that, in our opinion:

- the pension fund's financial statements present a true and fair view of the financial transactions of the pension fund during the year ended 31 March 2017 and the amount and disposition at that date of the fund's assets and liabilities; and
- the pension fund's financial statements have been properly prepared in accordance with the CIPFA/LASAAC Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016-17 and applicable law.

Conclusion on the Authority's arrangements for securing economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources

In our audit report for the year ended 31 March 2017 issued on 27 July 2017 we reported that, in our opinion, in all significant respects, the Authority put in place proper arrangements for securing economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources for the year ending 31 March 2017.

Certificate

In our report dated 27 July 2017, we explained that we could not formally conclude the audit on that date until we had completed:

- the work necessary to issue our Whole of Government Accounts (WGA) Component Assurance statement for the year ended 31 March 2017. We have now completed this work.
- our consideration of objections brought to our attention by local authority electors under Section 27 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014. These matters have now been dealt with.

No matters have come to our attention since that date that would have a material impact on the financial statements on which we gave an unqualified opinion and conclusion on the Authority's arrangements for securing economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.
