Multi-agency safeguarding adults training:

Self-neglect and hoarding

Half-day workshop

The training has been agreed and is commissioned by the Kent and Medway Safeguarding Adults Board, and is developed as part of an integrated programme of development for staff from statutory partner agencies. Each agency provides its own introductory safeguarding adults training, as well as other associated learning. Contact your agency's lead for learning and development to discuss available training relevant for your role.

This course is primarily for those staff with responsibility for direct practice in safeguarding. As safeguarding is integral to all work, it is important that delegates who attend the course have the agreement and support of their line manager and that adequate cover for attendee's absence has been arranged.

Coronavirus COVID-19 update

Whilst face to face training is not possible, facilitated online training sessions have been designed, enabling delegates to participate through a video conferencing platform, which will ensure training is interactive, practical and relevant to practice.

The Domestic Abuse workshop will be delivered across two half-day remote training sessions of 3 hours each, with built-in breaks. Where these take place on different dates, delegates must be able to attend both dates with the same group.

Course workbooks will be e-mailed in advance, along with detailed instructions for participants, including any preparation which may be required.

Who this course is for

Those with some experience and knowledge of safeguarding and who have completed their agency basic training. Delegates wishing to book a place should ensure the training is appropriate for their role and ideally the training need will have been identified in discussions with their manager.

Learning objectives

1. Participants will become familiar with Kent and Medway policy on self-neglect and hoarding and information sharing
2. An introduction to examples of positive intervention approaches
3. Training will use current research and learning from Safeguarding Adults Reviews (SARs) to inform decision-making and individual practice
4. Delegates will be provided with a model of collaborative working
5. There will be a focus on the inter-relationship between mental health issues and/or capacity issues when a person may be self-neglecting

Use will be made of Kent and Medway Multi-agency Policy and Procedures to Support People that Self-Neglect or Demonstrate Hoarding Behaviour. Current research and best practice will be featured to ensure interventions are effective. Learning from SARs and case examples will be used to adopt a strength-based collaborative working approach. The processes for escalation will be covered.

This training is commissioned by the Kent and Medway Safeguarding Adults Board (KMSAB), and delegates will be asked to work alongside colleagues from other professional backgrounds to ensure a multi-agency perspective.
