At the June KYCC meeting 45 members were present.

Campaign updates – Kent BIG issues

Anti-bullying – Filmed new video, wrote update for KYCC newsletter & annual report

Curriculum for life – Spent some time researching first aid training for schools, reviewed PowerPoints written for schools and adapted survey for use in schools and wrote update for newsletter

Mental health – Discussed annual report & wrote newsletter update, looked at calendar for social media posts

Developing resilience in young people – Wrote update for newsletter, planned next steps for campaign and discussed research on resilience

Morning choice sessions

Debating in the chamber - Group debated topic – University fees should be parallel to potential earnings post-graduation.

Equality – Group created some flag posters for LGBT+ subgroup, continued working on disability deaf leaflet and an ethnicity PowerPoint as resources for schools

Public Transport – Group worked on email for schools to accompany their competition & PowerPoint info and completed their survey for be produced and distributed after next meeting

UKYP – Discussed knife crime and solvent abuse, elected county social media reps to cover the 12 districts.
