

Dear Stakeholder,

We are still on track to complete the scheme by late spring/early summer this year. All the phases of the works are now almost completed. Works on the BT chamber is currently happening as per schedule, and we appreciate the understanding of the public regarding traffic management.

By mid-June, we anticipate carrying out the final night works of completing the entire road surfacing to complete the scheme, after which all traffic management will be removed from Bath Street, and we will begin demobilization.

### Progress Update

In April we saw the completion of the concrete pours to the underground chamber, and extraction of the temporary works ground support system. We carried out further surfacing works bringing new surfacing closer to completion, this has now enabled us to open Bath Street in part to two lanes. We also carried out some essential repair works to the Darnley Road and New Road Junction.
