

**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (A28 STURRY LINK ROAD)  
(SIDE ROADS) ORDER 2023  
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980**

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The Kent County Council makes this Order in exercise of powers conferred by sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and all other powers enabling them in that behalf:

1. The Council is authorised in relation to the classified road in the Canterbury City Council area to:
  - (a) improve, divert, raise, lower, or otherwise alter the lengths of highway named in the Schedule and shown on the Order Map by cross hatching (Section 14 (a)(i));
  - (b) stop up each private means of access to premises described in the Schedule and shown on the Order Map by a solid black band (Section 125 (a)); and
  - (c) provide new private means of access to premises at each location shown on the Order Map by thin diagonal hatching (Section 125 (b)).
2. Where a new access is to be provided in connection with the stopping up of a private means of access described in the Schedule, its reference letter is placed in the Schedule opposite the description of that length.
3. The Order Map shows the works indicated in the Schedule, and has the same number or reference letter as the Schedule, and the route of the classified road in relation to those works.
4. In this Order:
  - (a) distances are measured along the route of the relevant highway or private means of access, as the case may be;
  - (b) a reference to a schedule or map is a reference to the Schedule or the Order Map so numbered;
  - (c) “the classified road” means the highway which the Council proposes to:

construct between A28 Sturry Road, approximately 100 metres east of Water Treatment Works and the north side of the Ashford to Ramsgate railway line, approximately 395 metres east of Broad Oak railway level crossing.

and which is a proposed highway which is a classified road in accordance with section 12 of the Highways Act 1980;

“the Council” – means The Kent County Council

“improvement” – in relation to a highway includes diverting, raising, lowering, or otherwise altering that highway, and “improved” shall be construed accordingly;

“new access” means a private means of access to premises authorised by this Order to be provided;

“Schedule” - means the Schedule to this Order:

“Order Map” means the map prepared in duplicate and marked Map referred to in The Kent County Council (Sturry Link Road) (Side Roads) Order 2023 (the “Order Map”) sealed with the Common Seal of the Council.

5. One duplicate of the Order Map is deposited at the offices of Kent County Council, Sessions House, County Hall, Maidstone, ME14 1XQ and the other at the offices of Canterbury City Council, Military Road, Canterbury CT1 1YW. A28 Sturry Road from 5 metres north east of the entrance to Waste Treatment Works in a north east direction for 200 metres.	A
Shalloak Road from Broad Oak level crossing for a distance of 110 metres in a north east direction.	B
<b><u>Private means of access</u></b>	
Access from the Classified Road to Perryfield Farm from a point 25 metres north east from the roundabout junction.	1
Access from the Classified Road to future employment use land from a point 10 metres west from the roundabout junction.	2
<b><u>Private means of access to be stopped up</u></b>	
(X1) Access from A28 Sturry Road to Perryfield Farm from a point 3 metres from the south west boundary of Perryfield Farm.	1
(X2) Access from A28 Sturry Road to future employment use land between Waste Treatment Works and Perryfield Farm from a point 95 metres north east of the entrance to Waste Treatment Works.	2
