Dear stakeholder,

The Grovehurst Road Improvement Scheme has continued to progress, and we are still on schedule for completion in summer 2025. As always, we continue to find ways to adapt our traffic management plans to minimise congestion as much as possible.

Traffic Management Update

We are preparing to fully reopen the A249 in both directions by removing the traffic management from the road.

The north-bound A249 from 8pm Wednesday 18th December until 5am on Thursday 19th December to remove the barrier. The cones will remain in place until the barrier can be removed from the opposite southbound side, which will see the road closed again from 8pm on Thursday 19th December until 5am on Friday 20th December.

The road will then be fully reopened with two lanes in each direction. The traffic management will not be needed for the ongoing phases of the project, but occasional evening road closures will be required later in 2025.

As the works continue to progress, there will be closures of the A249 north and southbound slip roads, as well as closures to Grovehurst Road north (towards Iwade) and Grovehurst Road south (B2005) scheduled to take place from January 2025. Closer to the time, we will be sending out more details of these closures and diversion routes where applicable.

Current and Upcoming Works

Northern Gyratory

At the new developers roundabout (towards Iwade), coal tar surfacing of the existing road has been removed, and utility service providers are now exposing unidentified and redundant services.



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At the northbound entry slip road, dished drainage channel installation, gully reinstatement, and installation of vehicle restraint barriers are ongoing. Earthworks and embankment installation is also progressing in this area.

At the northbound exit slip road, vegetation clearance is now completed, and Southern Water will be undertaking directional drilling in this area.

New Bridge

Works on the wingwalls have progressed. Backfill around abutments and drainage installations are still ongoing. Parapet stringers on the bridge deck have been poured and now awaiting installation of the parapets in the coming weeks.

Southern Gyratory

Drainage, earthworks and subbase activities have progressed in these areas. Kerbing, base and binder have been installed to the southbound exit slip road and part of the gyratory. Ducting works for utility service cables, street lighting and signals are also progressing.

Ducting and drainage works have continued around Nicholls access. BT chamber and ducting works are now completed in the southern quadrant area. Temporary fill and type 1 for the temporary surfacing has been installed, and Southern Water are undertaking directional drilling activities in the bowl area of the gyratory.

Working in the community
