Online event streamed live from London

This very special event is being held to pay tribute to the work of the dedicated social care workforce throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. It will provide an opportunity to say a simple thank you to all those social care workers who provided care and support during these tough times, for us all to reflect on what everybody working together has achieved, and to remember and pay tribute to those we have lost.



Sadly, an estimated 969 social care workers in England tragically lost their lives between March 2020 and September 2021.

Minister of Health and Social Care Gillian Keegan is attending to lead the tributes and thank you messages. Representatives, working at all levels from across the sector have been invited to share their own experiences of the pandemic, and personal reflections. The event will conclude with a poem dedicated to the social care workforce and a minute's silence.

The event is being held online and will be streamed live.

National Adult Social Care Survey: actions for care home managers

The Adult Social Care survey is a national survey co-ordinated by NHS Digital and all local authorities with social services responsibilities are required to take part. It asks people we support about their quality of life and their experiences of the services they receive. The results will be used by Kent County Council, NHS Digital and the Department of Health and Social Care to assess the experiences of people accessing care and support services.

It will not be used to assess the performance of individual care homes, as procedures are already in place to do this via the CQC inspection process. You can see an example of the report and the questionnaire on the NHS Digital publication page:

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Free Support to complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit

Kent County Council (KCC) in Partnership with Kent Integrated Care Alliance (KICA) are supporting social care providers across Kent and Medway to register on and complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT).



The DSPT is a free online self-assessment of your organisation’s data and cyber security and is recognised as the official tool to evaluate your compliance with legal requirements, Data Security Standards and good practice. It is also required in order to access key services such as NHSmail, proxy ordering for medication and shared care records.

Helping Hands scheme - Supporting households facing financial hardship as a direct result of COVID-19

The Fuel Costs Support Voucher scheme is now available to Kent residents, in partnership with Green Doctors and this may be of interest to the people you support.



About the scheme

The ‘Helping Hands’ scheme offers fuel vouchers towards the cost of heating bills and essential items related to keeping warm. The vouchers will support households facing financial hardship as a direct result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Applicants can apply for up to 3 vouchers towards heating bills (must have a top-up meter) or essential items such as:

- boiler repairs
- temporary heaters
- thick curtains
- blankets (at the discretion of district and borough council officers.)

Referrers will need to check that the applicant has suffered a loss of income as a direct result of COVID-19. (For example, being put on furlough, reduced trade or business, increased heating bills by working from home.) Have you heard of 'Breathing Space'?

1 in 4 people will develop a mental health problem and 50% of those who experience mental distress also have a problem with debt. The Mental Health Crisis Breathing Space (MHCBS) service can provide protection to those suffering a mental health crisis who are struggling with debt. If anyone you support is struggling with a mental health crisis, you can refer them under the scheme. Full referral criteria can be found online:

Protections can include:

- freezing interest and other charges
- pausing enforcement and collection
- preventing contact from creditors.

These protections can last for up to 30 days after the mental health crisis has ended. Under the scheme, people will be given legal protections from their creditors for 60 days, with most interest and penalty charges frozen, and enforcement action halted.

People who are eligible will also receive professional debt advice to design a plan which helps to get their finances back on track.

And recognising the link between problem debt and mental health issues, these protections will be available for people in mental health crisis treatment – for the full duration of their crisis treatment plus another 30 days.
