Dear stakeholder,

We are making progress constructing the new slip roads and bridge. We have taken measures to accommodate the intermittent closures of the Kingsferry Bridge by adjusting our construction schedule, to help reduce congestion as much as possible.

Traffic Management Schedule

As per the revised programme, the work schedule below has been provided as a reference. Due to the impactful nature of extensive road works, we are in collaboration with National Highways, Kent County Council Streetworks, and Network Rail to develop traffic management plans in order to minimise disruption. Updates on significant adjustments to this schedule will be sent to stakeholders if things change. We will also give plenty of notice before traffic management measures are brought in.

Current and Upcoming Works

New bridge over the A249

We have completed the first stage of backfilling to the newly built bridge walls on both sides of the A249. The drainage system is also completed. Construction of the new bridge beam is currently going on off site.

Highways

Type 1 subbase on the northern gyratory has been installed to allow kerbing works to commence. Utility cables at the northern gyratory have been exposed and lowered to allow the completion of fill at the Grovehurst road tie in. Lighting and sign clearance, drainage and earthworks at the northbound exit slip road, towards the Isle of Sheppey, and existing northern roundabout are ongoing and will progress into the coming month.

Working in our Community

On Thursday, June 20, our team went to talk to pupils at Newington Church of England Primary School about engineering and construction. The pupils were excited to learn about the works and asked lots of questions about how to be safe while working on construction sites.

On Thursday, June 27, we also visited Oasis Academy: Isle of Sheppey to talk to more than 300 Year 9 and Year 10 pupils, introducing them to careers in civil engineering and other opportunities that major projects like ours can present and what it's like working for a construction company.











The presentation was hosted in two sessions, one for each year group. After each the speakers talked about the Grovehurst Road Improvement Scheme and answered questions from pupils and teachers.
