‘Homes for Ukrainian’ Refugees Scheme

The Government is asking individuals, charities, community groups and businesses across the country to offer their support to people displaced from Ukraine and their immediate family member who need a route to safety.

Anyone who is in a position to help, who fulfils the sponsorship requirements and with a spare room or empty home, is urged to step forward and join the ‘Homes for Ukraine’ sponsorship scheme. (continued on page 2)

In return for providing accommodation for a minimum of six months, the Government is offering an optional 'thank you' payment of £350 per month to people who can accommodate one or more household (subject to the accommodation they have) for up to 12 months. The intention is that these payments will be tax free for individuals and will not affect benefit entitlement and will legislate if necessary. Local authorities will be given a total of £10,500 in extra funding per refugee for support services.

Respond, Recover, Reset: The Voluntary Sector and COVID-19

Led by a team at Nottingham Trent and Sheffield Hallam Universities, with support from NCVO, this project examines the impact of COVID-19 on voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations. In particular, it focused on providing real-time data about how the pandemic is impacting voluntary organisations working-practices and operations, their responses, learning and resilience. The Final Full Project Report is expected to be available in March 2022.

Laureus Sport for Peace Humanitarian Action Fund (Help for Victims of the Ukraine War)

Funding is to be made available to support agencies on the ground in Ukraine providing food, emergency water, medicine, hygiene kits to prevent disease, shelter and safe spaces for mothers and children on the move, to help a growingly desperate and vulnerable population.

Kent County Council – Crowdfund Kent Fund

Grants of up to £20,000 are available for constituted not-for-profit organisations, charities, and voluntary and community groups who can raise their initial funding through a crowdfunding campaign to support projects that benefit the residents and communities in Kent.

This is a match-funding initiative delivered in partnership with Spacehive. Kent County Council will match up to 50% of the money raised by groups through Crowdfunder, up to a maximum of £20,000 (up to 65% may be considered for projects in deprived areas).

Funding is for projects that align to the strategic priorities of the Council and that meet one of the following objectives:

- Delivering community activities in Kent that are focused on supporting people who have been particularly impacted by Covid, e.g. BAME communities, those living in poverty, victims of domestic abuse, people with mental health problems, vulnerable children, carers, people with learning disabilities, care home residents and older people
- Supporting community assets and venues in Kent, that contribute to local communities and local connections, improving wellbeing
- Helping to maintain the volunteering offer/social action seen during the pandemic post Covid-19

Arts and Culture

Arts Council England National Lottery Projects Grants

Grants of between £1,000 and £100,000 are available for individual artists, community and cultural organisations to support arts, museums and libraries projects that engage people in England with arts and culture. Projects can range from directly creating and delivering creative and cultural activity to projects which have a longer term positive impact, such as organisational development, research and development and sector support and development. The funding is for projects that are focused on one or more of the following disciplines:

- Music
- Theatre
- Dance
- Visual arts
- Literature
- Combined arts - including festivals and carnivals

Grants can support projects where the capital-specific expenditure in a project totals less than £100,000.

Ashley Family Foundation

Grants are available for projects that fit with the Foundation's ethos of protecting rural communities and encouraging participation in the arts. Grants are provided to support community museums, farms, gardens, schools and other charitable organisations with small-scale arts and community projects. The Foundation wants to use its funding to develop strong communities, social welfare and creative arts, with a particular emphasis on supporting rural communities. DCMS/Wolfson Museums and Galleries Improvement Fund

Grants of up to a maximum £300,000 are available to museums and galleries for projects that improve the physical infrastructure of the institution concerned to enhance the display, care and accessibility of significant collections. Funding sought must be no more than 75% of the total eligible project cost. In 2022, the funding is for projects that meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Material improvements to the display and interpretation of collections, in permanent galleries, exhibition spaces and public spaces, to enhance visitor experience
- Improvements to access and/or interpretation for visitors with disabilities
- Improvements to environmental controls, collections storage and conservation facilities to enhance the care of collections

All projects are expected to be environmentally sustainable.

Film and TV Charity - Freelancer Connector Grants

Grants of up to £3,500 are available to support peer-led projects that bring together professional UK film and television freelancers to offer mutual support, build social connections and grow peer-to-peer networks. Grants may be used to support project management, core activities, facilitation and administration costs.

Help Musicians - Music-led Creative Collaboration

Grants of up to £5,000 are available for professional musicians in the UK to undertake a UK-based collaboration with other non-music artists. Eligible costs and activities include:

- Venue and rehearsal space.
- Recording costs (live or documentation - but not studio recording)
- Travel and access
- Accommodation
- Fees for musicians, artists or collaborators' time to allow for collaboration to happen
- Any other reasonable costs associated with creative collaboration

There should be an end result of the collaboration, such as a body of work created for an upcoming recording or a new performance, which ultimately, should push the boundaries of what the applicant does as a music creator.

Business and Employment

Kent Community Foundation - Employability, Skills and Enterprise

Grants averaging £4,000 are available for projects which raise the aspirations and increase the skills and opportunities of people who are far from the labour market. The theme supports projects working with young people/ NEETs, young parents, ex-offenders, ex-forces, those with financial barriers and those with learning disabilities, mental health issues or physical disabilities.

The Fund is looking for projects that provide accredited training, apprenticeships, meaningful work experience and life skills/employment skills workshops for the disadvantaged. It also supports strategic projects which aim to prevent young people from becoming NEETs.

Kent Social Enterprise Loan Fund (KSELF)

KSELF is a social lending programme, aiming to bridge the increasing funding gap for new and existing social enterprises in Kent and Medway, by offering unsecured loans of between £10,000 and £100,000. The financial package will include an element of up to 30% grant of the loan amount. The aim of the Fund is to spread

the culture of social enterprise, break down the barriers which prevent enterprising social businesses from accessing finance and encourage a more enterprising approach to achieving positive change in our communities. Once finance is repaid, it will be re-loaned and re-invested back in the community. The fund is managed by the Kent Community Foundation.

Innovate UK - Smart Grants

UK registered organisations can apply for a share of up to £25million to support business-focused, commercially viable R&D innovation that can significantly impact the UK economy.

The Smart Grants programme is an 'open grant funding' initiative from Innovate UK (IUK). Through the programme, IUK is investing in commercially viable, business-focused, innovative or disruptive ideas that have potential to boost the UK's economy.

This round of the competition will be the last in the current format. Future rounds of the Smart grant will be more focused on supporting proposals from UK-based innovative businesses that are destined for early, successful commercialisation, growth and exports.

Innovate UK - Innovation Loans Future Economy Competition

UK SMEs can access loans that are affordable, patient and flexible for late stage innovation projects that have a clear route to commercial success. Innovate UK (IUK) has allocated up to £25 million to fund projects across four rounds of this competition. Loans of between £100,000 and £2 million are available, based on project proposals and IUK's judgement of the suitability and affordability of a loan for the business. IUK will fund experimental development projects that can include prototyping, demonstrating, piloting, testing and validation. Projects must focus on one or more of the following themes:

- Net Zero
- Health and wellbeing
- Next generation digital technologies
- Technology families

Thomas Wall Trust - Grants for Individuals

Applicants must be experiencing financial and other challenges e.g., disability, major trauma or a life event, mental health issues, carer responsibilities, care leaver, estranged from family, English language learners (ELL), child care responsibilities. FCC Community Action Fund

Grants of between £2,000 and £100,000 are available to not-for-profit organisations for amenity projects eligible under Object D of the Landfill Communities Fund (LCF). The funding is for projects sited within 10 miles of an eligible FCC Environment waste facility (in Kent, there are facilities located in Allington and Isle of Sheppey).

The funding can be used for the provision, maintenance or improvement of the following types of public amenity:

- Village halls and community centres
- Public play areas
- Publicly available Multi use games areas, skate parks and BMX tracks
- Sport and recreation grounds including pavilions and clubhouses with full public access
- Churches – community spaces only
- Nature reserves
- Public gardens, parks, country parks, woodlands with dawn to dusk access
- Museums

The kinds of costs that may be included in the required funding are: contractors, materials, capital items, small items of equipment used by volunteers and staff to deliver the project.

- Helping more people to reach their potential, by supporting them at the earliest possible stage

The Fund continues to support people and communities most adversely impacted by COVID-19. Organisations can apply for funding to:

- Continue to deliver activity - whether the community needs crisis response, recovery or business as usual activity
- Change and adapt, becoming more resilient to respond to new and future challenges

The grants can be used for the following costs:

- **Direct costs** associated with delivering activities in the community, including: project staff, materials, equipment, volunteer expenses, project evaluations

Kent Community Foundation - Environment
