2019 John Downton Awards 22 October 2019 – 8 January 2020

We would like to invite you to take part in the John Downton Awards for Young Artists. This year's exhibition will take place in the County Gallery, County Hall, Maidstone, from 22 October 2019 to 8 January 2020, with an awards ceremony on 19 November. A selection of the works will be taken from Maidstone to be shown at Turner Contemporary from 18 January – 8 March 2020.

Background information

The John Downton Awards were first organised in 2000 at the request of Miss Hilda Downton – sister of the celebrated Kentish artist, poet and philosopher, to recognise the achievements of the young artists of Kent in the fields of painting and drawing.

Accepted media

<u>Most</u> 2D work is acceptable, including drawing, painting, printmaking, photography and collage. We cannot accept 3D work including sculpture, installation, performance or film work or any work that is larger in size than 1.20 metres in either direction.

Please note that all work must be securely packaged for transportation and clearly labelled with both the name and age of the student and the name of the school.

Prizes and awards

There will be prizes for the top three individuals in each of the age groups, 11–16 and 17–18 plus Highly Commended in each age group. The John Downton trophy will be awarded for the best overall submission by a school. There are media specific prizes in painting, drawing, photography and mixed media in each age group and a People's Choice Prize which is voted for by visitors to the exhibition.

Submissions

Submissions are made online by the school only (see below for details). The deadline for submission is noon on Tuesday 17 September. Late applications will not be considered.

Schools may submit ONE piece each per student, with no limit on the number of submissions per school. Any school submitting more than one piece of work per student will be automatically excluded from the selection process.

Successful entrants will be notified by the end of September. Work selected for the exhibition will be collected by courier / delivered to Maidstone week commencing 14 October.

Terms and Conditions

Exhibition

- The exhibition is open from 22 October 2019 8 January 2020, 9 am 6 pm (excluding weekends)
- Awards will be presented at two events during the evening of 19 November

Eligibility

- Open young people living in Kent aged 11 18 on 31 August 2019
- Work should have been produced between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019
- Painting, print-making, drawing, photography and collage can be accepted. We cannot accept sculpture, installation, performance or film work, or any large work over 1.20 metres in any one direction.

Submissions

- Submissions must be made by the SCHOOL only by completing the online application form.
 Due to the new GDPR regulations we are unable to accept submissions directly from students.
- For students aged 11 12 schools are required to obtain parental/guardian consent to submit work and for students aged 13 18 schools are required to obtain the student's consent. Please note that we reserve the right to request a copy of that consent.
- All fields on the application form must be completed
- Application forms should be accompanied by a clearly named jpeg image of the work that does not exceed 300 dpi and has a file size below 3Mb
- Jpeg images should be titled following the convention: firstnamelastname.jpg. Images must be clear, the correct orientation, and cropped where appropriate to show the image only and not surrounding backgrounds or reflections.
- A maximum of **one** entry per student is allowed
- All applications must be received by noon on 17 September 2019. Late submissions will not be accepted
- Once work is submitted, we reserve the right to publish any images in Kent County Council/ Culture & Creative Economy Service publicity/information material and online media, along with the name of the artist. Fixing requirements for selected work

Work must be supplied framed or presented in such a way so that it can be securely wall mounted with mirror plates fitted as appropriate.

Work supplied without appropriate mirror plates and screw fittings will not be hung. Where mirror plates cannot be fitted due to the nature of the frame, other fixings must be supplied. Where these are not supplied and if the work can be hung using pins, nails or staples, this will be at the exhibitor's own risk and cost. Work unable to be hung must be collected at exhibitor's expense.

Submission of work by an exhibitor in this way is taken as acceptance of that risk.

Judging panel

- The work will be judged by a professional panel

 Work will be returned following the exhibition unless it is required for exhibition at Turner Contemporary, Margate, in which case it will be returned following this additional exhibition

Insurance

- All work will be insured against damage in transit and during the exhibition
- All work is insured for public liability
- To comply with insurance requirements, work should be supplied with mirror plates attached for securely fixing the work to the wall

The gallery can accommodate approximately 100 pieces, so regrettably we will be unable to show all work that is submitted.
