Introduction

It is Kent and Medway's top priority to keep adults at risk safe. In order to meet with the requirements of the Care Act 2014, all Safeguarding Adult Boards must have in place a safeguarding strategy that sets out the direction of travel, providing a clear map of its intentions. The Kent and Medway Safeguarding Strategy meets this requirement but goes further in its ambition.

In Kent and Medway we have already built a bonded, committed, and wide ranging multi-agency safeguarding partnership. It is only because of that partnership and its strength, that we can be successful in sharing our mutual safeguarding responsibilities. We will continuously work together to prevent abuse and neglect, create awareness and assure quality is our driver.

This sets out our strategy and our business plan, which clearly shows: our three priorities, what we must achieve, how we will achieve it, with whom and by when. This gives our strong partnership efforts true direction, and creates the opportunity to take our work to the next stage, together. Going forward, it will provide the opportunity to measure our achievements and analyse if we have any gaps, so that the Board can make an expedient and appropriate response.
