This letter is written in accordance with The Children Act 2004 (Joint Area Reviews) Regulations 2015¹ to inform Kent Clinical Commissioning Group, Thanet Clinical Commissioning Group and Kent county council, as principal authorities, that Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission have jointly evaluated the written statement of action resubmitted to us on 7 August 2019.

The statement of action is deemed to be fit for purpose in setting out how the local area will tackle the significant areas of weakness identified in the published report letter.

I note that the written statement has been improved in several ways. More direct links have been made between the planned actions and outcomes for children and young people. Actions showing how inclusion will be developed and areas of weakness identified are more developed. The need to ensure that all schools play their role in the local area features more strongly. The planned involvement of parents and carers in designing and reviewing services has been strenghtened.
