





This is the Adult Safeguarding Easy Read privacy notice.

Who are we?

- We are Kent County Council. We look after public services which support people in Kent.
- Adult Social Care and Health work with you to help you look after your care and support.

This can include physical health and mental health.

 We also work with other organisations to keep people safe. Safeguarding means to protect an adult's right to live in safety and to be free from abuse and neglect.

Why do we use your information

- We required by law to provide health and social care services. This means we are covered by law to use your information. We do not always have to ask for your permission to use your information.
- We will only share information when we need to do so and with people who need to know. We have security in place to stop information being used in the wrong way.
- We also have to make sure we follow data protection laws. This is

the UK General Data Protection Regulation. This means we have to provide certain information to you. We use this privacy notice to keep you updated.

What information will we use?

- We will use your personal information. This can include your name, address, date of birth and telephone number.
- This can also include contact details for your family and support network, information about your finances and any photographs to help us when putting in any equipment.
- We will also use special category information. This is information that is more sensitive. This can include your needs and wishes, your concerns, your situation and any health conditions or disabilities.
- This can also include information about your race, beliefs and sexual orientation.
- We may also use your criminal offence information. This may relate to investigations, allegations, convictions etc. We only use this when we need to, to make sure we provide the right care and support and to ensure your and others safety.
- We may collect this information from you, and share with other



	organisations who look after your health or people that may know you.
	Who will we share your information with?
	 We will only share information to organisations who will help you to look after your health and social care. This can include NHS trusts, GPs, people acting on your behalf, other local authorities etc. We may also share information
	that has your personal details removed. This helps us to keep track of how well we are doing and what we can do to improve.
How long do we keep your information for?	
	 We can only keep information for as long as we need it.
	• We have a record document that tells us how long we can keep information for. This will be different depending on the information we use.
	 We check regularly to make sure we only keep information that is useful to us.
	What are my rights?
	 You have rights under the UK General Data Protection
