Multi-agency safeguarding adults training:

Adult legal literacy

One-day workshop – delivered over two half-day sessions

The training has been agreed and is commissioned by the Kent and Medway Safeguarding Adults Board, and is developed as part of an integrated programme of development for staff from statutory partner agencies. Each agency provides its own introductory safeguarding adults training, as well as other associated learning. Contact your agency's lead for learning and development to discuss available training relevant for your role.

This course is primarily for those staff with responsibility for direct practice in safeguarding. As safeguarding is integral to all work, it is important that delegates who attend the course have the agreement and support of their line manager and that adequate cover for attendee's absence has been arranged.

Coronavirus COVID-19 update

Whilst face to face training is not possible, facilitated online training sessions have been designed, enabling delegates to participate through a video conferencing platform, which will ensure training is interactive, practical and relevant to practice.

The Adult Legal Literacy workshop will be delivered across two half-day remote training sessions of 3 hours each, with built-in breaks. Where these take place on different dates, delegates must be able to attend both dates with the same group.

Course workbooks will be e-mailed in advance, along with detailed instructions for participants, including any preparation which may be required.

Who this course is for

Those with some experience and knowledge of safeguarding and who have completed their agency basic training.

Delegates wishing to book a place should ensure the training is appropriate for their role and ideally the training need will have been identified in discussions with their manager.

Learning objectives

1. Delegates will have an understanding and knowledge of the current legislative framework which underpins adult safeguarding, including advocacy
2. Understanding of key agency responsibilities and roles, to include information sharing, information recording and, where forensic material was collected, how to present findings and evidence to legal requirements

3. Participants will understand the role and function of KMSAB, including when and how to make a SAR referral. Highlight of KMSAB policies, including the KMSAB Policy, Protocols and Practitioner Guidance for Kent and Medway document which will be referenced throughout the training
4. The course will explore the implications of a situation where a person has mental capacity and address the impact of duress, undue influence and coercion
5. Delegates will understand the importance of working collaboratively

The use of research to illustrate evidence-based practice will be included. The legislation reviewed will include Human Rights Act, 1998, Care Act, 2014, Mental Health Act, 1983, Mental Capacity Act, 2005, Prevent, Data Protection Act 2018, GDPR and Criminal Law
