This masterclass will showcase current digital technology for care homes, provide top hints and tips for digitally connecting during Covid-19 and beyond, and is presented by:



#### **Updates from the Public Health Team**

#### **Staff Testing for Covid**

Please be mindful that as social care staff you are still required to have a confirmatory PCR test should you have a positive lateral flow device test.

Please continue to have a weekly Covid test even if you have received your first or both Covid 19 vaccinations. The vaccine is designed to prevent you developing a severe Covid infection and although early signs are good, we do not yet have evidence around reduction of transmission of the virus following vaccination.

#### Covid-19 vaccinations

By now, the majority of staff and residents in older people's care homes should have received the vaccine. The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisations (JCVI) is currently considering the priority groups for the next rounds of vaccination and we are aware that other care settings are being considered, e.g. Learning Disability Care Providers.

As a public health team, we highly recommend the Covid-19 vaccination. Up to one third of people have side effects from the vaccine, but these are usually very mild e.g. a sore arm.

#### **Covid symptoms after vaccination**

Although a mild fever can occur within a day or two of vaccination, if staff or residents have any other Covid-19 symptoms or their fever lasts longer, they should stay at 'home' and arrange to have a test. Although it is not common, it is possible to have caught Covid-19 and not have symptoms for the first few days and so not realise before vaccination.

There is now an enhanced surveillance programme of Covid-19 vaccinated individuals taking place. To support this programme, please could staff in care homes contact the resident'(s)' GP where:

- A vaccinated resident(s)/clients present with Covid-19 symptoms 10 days of more after their first (or second) vaccination and,
- vaccinated residents/clients test positive for Covid (especially if there are no symptoms).

#### Infection control measures

Whilst care homes have suggested that additional infection control monies available might be used for specialist fogging machines to decontaminate the home, please be reminded that you should not rely on fogging to clean, but should implement enhanced environmental cleaning (e.g. using a solution with at least 1,000ppm available chorine) as per the PHE guidance.

#### **Workforce development:**

To support development of the workforce, the government has launched a new national recruitment campaign. The ambition is to attract an additional 20,000 people into social care over the next three months. <u>Campaign materials</u> are available to support local recruitment efforts.

This is on top of measures to fast track DBS checks for new recruits and volunteers and making available up to £3million to support free rapid online training for new recruits, existing staff, and volunteers. There is also a new, dedicated app for the adult social care workforce in England to support staff on-the-go.

Under the new CARE brand, the Care Workforce app provides a single digital hub for social care workers to access relevant updates, guidance, support and discounts from their phone.

# Important Customer Notice: BTP515 BTP9984 - Blayco Face Visor

Dear All,

This is an advisory notice in advance of more formal communications in relation to a Face Visor that has been sent out to Trusts at the end of December and January 2021.

We have received reports that the product has different labelling which indicates that the product is Latex Free and Latex containing and the supplier has now confirmed that the product is labelled with both symbols and that any labelled containing latex (see below) has a small amount of latex encapsulated in its head band – We are working with the supplier to confirm the type of latex hence this pre-notification.

We would ask that Trusts check their stock of face visors and if they have received Blayco face visors that they check the labelling and quarantine awaiting further updates.

#### 5 FEBRUARY: Severe cold weather warning – ice and snow
