such as care costs and contractual models to support future market sustainability and provision of care.

Working with our partners 31ten, we want to offer you the opportunity to participate and help us shape how we meet the care needs of our residents moving forward.

Over the coming weeks, 31ten will be contacting care providers on behalf of the Council and the NHS to schedule sessions where they will support you to share information on your current provision alongside your feedback and views on what the future should look like. These will be held virtually and in person and are intended as the first stage of an ongoing dialogue with you over the coming months into 2024. These discussions are intended as part of an informal early engagement opportunity.

#### Care Sector Digital Event

On 8 November, 180 care providers came together for a care sector digital event. The first part of the day set out the national and local drivers for being digital. In the afternoon providers had the opportunity to attend digital bitesize sessions and develop action plans. There was a marketplace showcasing the digital support across Kent and Medway. There was a buzz in the room and positive feedback on how the event has increased awareness and confidence.

Following on from the day we are now looking at a programme of digital sessions for 2024. And this will start with a workshop in January on digital social care records, where we will have the opportunity to learn from providers that have implemented, the challenges experienced and how these were addressed. Information about the digital social care records workshop will be sent out soon.

#### Funding has increased for International Recruitment

Due to unprecedented demand, two £1500 grants per care service are now available meaning providers can:



- access up to £3,000 towards their international recruitment CARE ALLIANCE costs!
- Providers who have previously received a £1,500 grant are now invited to apply for a second grant.

#### Please see details below:

The government has made funding available to support international recruitment into the social care sector during the 23-24 financial year.

In order to be eligible for a grant, a provider must meet the following criteria:

- Be registered with the CQC as a provider of social care
- Be located (determined by registered CQC location) in one of the Local Authority areas in the South East region
- Have an overall CQC rating which is above the 'Inadequate' rating at the time of application (i.e. 'Outstanding', 'Good' or 'Requires Improvement')
- EITHER intend to apply for a Licence to Sponsor skilled workers OR to hold a

licence already and intend to recruit at least one international worker on a Skilled Worker Visa between 1 April 2023 and 15 March 2024

- Confirm that they will understand and will abide by the provisions of the Ethical Recruitment Framework (See the Code of Practice: <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/code-of-practice-for-the-international-recruitment-of-health-and-social-care-personnel/code-of-practice-for-the-international-recruitment-of-health-and-social-care-personnel-in-england)</u>
- Confirm that they are able to offer any international workers they recruit work in accordance with the requirements of the Skilled Worker Visa
- Correctly and fully complete the correct <u>application form</u>.

A provider's eligibility will be assessed at the time of application. Each must apply to the hub for the local authority whose area includes that location. For Kent and Medway, this is the Kent Integrated Care Alliance (KiCA).

Providers do not need to have applied for a licence or recruited a skilled worker in order to apply for a grant, however they will have to provide evidence that their licence has been awarded or that they have employed a new skilled worker **between 1 April 2023 and 15 March 2024** before a grant will be paid to them.

The <u>application</u> is for providers included in the **Kent and Medway Council Districts.** Please ensure it is completed in its entirety, double check all details are correct, and do not hesitate to contact <u>recruitment@kica.care</u> or <u>grants@sesca.org.uk</u> if you have any concerns or queries.
