Indices of Deprivation 2010: Ward level summaries for Kent

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Further information

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This bulletin presents an analysis of the Indices of Deprivation 2010 for wards in Kent. Kent in this bulletin refers to the Kent County Council area which does not include Medway.

Summary of findings

- Margate Central ward in Thanet District ranks as the most deprived ward within Kent. See table 2.
- Thanet has the greatest number of wards which are ranked within the 20% most deprived in Kent.
- A total of 13 of Thanet's wards, (57% of all Thanet wards) are ranked within the 20% most deprived in Kent.
- Shepway and Thanet are the only 2 local authorities to have no wards which rank within the 20% least deprived wards in Kent.
- Allington ward in Maidstone Borough ranks as the least deprived ward within Kent. See Table 2.
- Sevenoaks has the greatest number of wards which are ranked within the 20% least deprived in Kent. See Table 1 for details
- A total of 15 of Sevenoaks' wards, (58% of all Sevenoaks wards) are ranked within the 20% least deprived in Kent. See Table 1 for details.
- All 12 local authorities have at least one ward which is ranked within the top 20% most deprived wards in Kent.



Introduction

The English Indices of Deprivation 2010 (ID2010) were released by Communities and Local Government (CLG) on 24 March 2011. The Indices provide an area based measure of deprivation. Each area is assigned a deprivation score and rank so that their level of deprivation can be measured <u>relative</u> to other areas.

The ID2010 measures deprivation for local authority areas and also Lower Super Output Areas (LSOA). The LSOA component of the ID2010 is referred to as the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) and provides the most detailed measure of deprivation. On average there are 3-4 LSOAs within a single electoral ward and therefore LSOAs allow a more detailed pattern of deprivation <u>within</u> a ward to be identified.

A ward level measure of deprivation is not published as part of the official ID2010 as the primary aim of the Indices is to understand the level and nature of deprivation at the small area level and LSOAs were thought to provide a better measure of this. However, there is high demand for a ward level measure and for this reason Kent County Council's (KCC's) Research & Evaluation team (like many other local government research teams) have calculated ward deprivation scores. Further detail on how the ward scores have been calculated is outlined in the Methodology section.

Although ward scores have been produced, Research & Evaluation still recommend that users look at the LSOA deprivation data because pockets of deprivation are likely to be masked at ward level.

Methodology

No attempt has been made to produce actual IMD scores for wards. Rather, ward level summaries have been created from the LSOA level data, replicating as far as possible the methodology used to produce the official local authority area summaries.

Research & Evaluation have chosen to replicate the measure 'average of LSOA scores' at ward level. This measure was chosen because it takes account of the full range of LSOA deprivation scores within a ward, which may not be revealed to the

same extent if one of the other measures was used. This is also KCC's preferred measure when using the local authority summaries.

The 'average of LSOA scores' measure is calculated by first multiplying the IMD scores for each LSOA by the population estimate for that LSOA. These figures are then summed across all LSOAs within the ward and the result is divided by the total population for that ward.

Research & Evaluation have produced 'average of LSOA scores' for all wards within the Kent. The resulting scores have then been ranked. A rank of 1 represents the most deprived ward and a rank of 283 represents the least deprived ward in Kent. National comparisons at ward level are not possible because ward measures have not been calculated for wards outside of Kent.

County summary of ward level measure

There are 283 electoral wards within Kent. Those ranked in positions 1 to 57 are classed as being within Kent's most deprived 20% of wards and those ranked in positions 227 to 283 are classed as being within Kent's least deprived 20% of wards. Table 1 shows how many of Kent wards are within the county's most and least deprived 20% by local authority area.

All local authority areas have at least one ward in the county's 20% most deprived. However, there is greater concentration in East Kent authorities. For example just under a quarter of Kent's most deprived 20% of wards are located within Thanet. Not all Kent local authority areas have wards in the county's 20% least deprived. There are no wards in Shepway or Thanet in the county's least deprived 20%. West Kent authorities tend to have higher concentrations of least deprived wards. For example just over a quarter of Kent's least deprived 20% of wards are located in Sevenoaks.

The difference between the East and West Kent authorities is clear in Table 2 which presents Kent's top ten most deprived and top ten least deprived wards.






Average of LSOA Overall IMD2010 Scores for Wards in Canterbury


Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Canterbury (based on average of LSOA scores)

Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Dartford (based on average of LSOA scores)




Average of LSOA Overall IMD2010 Scores for Wards in Dover

Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Dover (based on average of LSOA scores)




Average of LSOA Overall IMD2010 Scores for Wards in Gravesham

Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Gravesham (based on average of LSOA scores)




Average of LSOA Overall IMD2010 Scores for Wards in Maidstone

Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Maidstone (based on average of LSOA scores)







Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Shepway (based on average of LSOA scores)




Average of LSOA Overall IMD2010 Scores for Wards in Swale

Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Swale (based on average of LSOA scores)





Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Thanet (based on average of LSOA scores)




Average of LSOA Overall IMD2010 Scores for Wards in Tonbridge & Malling

Overall IMD 2010 for electoral wards in Tonbridge & Malling (based on average of LSOA scores)




Average of LSOA Overall IMD2010 Scores for Wards in Tunbridge Wells
