

Unemployment in Kent

All data comes from the Claimant Count by Sex and Age data set, released monthly by the Office for National Statistics. The latest data is for May 2025 and includes revisions to data for April 2025. Data for June 2025 is due to be released on 17th July 2025.

NOTE: The term "Kent" refers to the Kent County Council area and excludes Medway.

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Kent facts and figures

This bulletin looks at the number of people claiming either Jobseekers Allowance or Universal Credit principally for the reason of being unemployed in May 2025. It also looks at the age and sex of claimants, in particular at youth unemployment which is defined as those aged 18 to 24.

Headlines

- 33,215 people were claiming unemployment benefits in Kent in May 2025.
- The number of people who were unemployed in Kent has increased by 1.4% (+455) since the previous month.
- The unemployment rate in Kent is 3.4% (GB 4.1%).
- Youth unemployment in Kent (18 to 24 year-olds) is 5.9%, higher than the national rate of 5.4%.
- Thanet (11.4%) has the highest rate of youth unemployment in the South East.
- Thanet, Dover, Folkestone & Hythe, Swale, and Gravesham have some of the highest youth unemployment rates in the South East.
- Unemployment increased for males (+1.8%) and females (+0.9%) over the last month.





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Introduction

This bulletin looks at the number of people claiming either Jobseekers Allowance or Universal Credit principally for the reason of being unemployed. It also looks at the age and sex of claimants, in particular at youth unemployment which is defined as those aged 18 to 24.

This bulletin uses information from a dataset called The Claimant Count by Sex and Age. This experimental series counts the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance plus those who claim Universal Credit who are out of work.

Under Universal Credit a broader span of claimants are required to look for work than under Jobseeker's Allowance. As Universal Credit Full Service is rolled out in particular areas, the number of people recorded as being on the Claimant Count is therefore likely to rise.

Unemployment rates are calculated using the Office for National Statistics Mid-Year Population Estimates 2007-2023. The resident working age population is defined as all males and females aged 16-64. These denominators will be updated annually with the ONS mid-year population estimates.

Introduction of Universal Credit

Since 2013 the roll out of Universal Credit has progressed across the UK. Universal Credit is replacing a number of means-tested benefits including the means-tested element of Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA).

DWP are gradually transferring claimants of existing benefits (those that Universal Credit was designed to replace) onto Universal Credit. This includes people claiming Working and Child Tax Credits (including people in receipt of Tax Credits and ESA), Job Seekers Allowance (Income-Related), Income Support (Income-Related) or Housing Benefit (Income-Related). This managed migration should be complete by March 2025. The managed migration of claimants on Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance, except for those receiving Child Tax Credit, will now take place in 2028.

Chart 1: Unemployment by sex in Kent





Chart 2: 18-24 year old unemployment in Kent compared to Great Britain










Chart 3: 18 to 24 unemployment rates in South East local authorities, May 2025





Chart 4: 18 to 24 year old unemployment in Kent compared to all other unemployed
