MULTI-AGENCY SAFEGUARDING ADULTS WORKSHOP: SECTION 42 CARE ACT 2014 – UNDERTAKING AND MANAGING ENQUIRIES

The training has been agreed and is commissioned by the Kent and Medway Safeguarding Adults Board, and is developed as part of an integrated programme of development for staff from statutory partner agencies. Each agency provides its own introductory safeguarding adults training, as well as other associated learning.

This course is primarily for those staff with responsibility for direct practice in safeguarding and who are likely to be involved with Safeguarding Enquiries. As safeguarding is integral to all work, it is important that delegates who attend the course have the agreement and support of their line manager.

Delegates wishing to book a place should ensure the training is appropriate for their role and contact their agency's lead for learning and development in the first instance. It is recommended that staff attend the one-day workshop on Policies, Procedures and Agency Responsibilities first, and have some practical experience in adult safeguarding

The training comprises:

Pre-reading, followed by one whole-day face-to-face workshop

(It is a pre-requisite for attendance on the course that you read the pre-course material, which will be e-mailed to you in advance)

WHO THIS COURSE IS AIMED AT:

Practitioners and senior operational staff with a specific role in assisting, undertaking and managing Enquiries under Section 42 of the Care Act, 2014, including Health Safeguarding Leads.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- To equip Inquiries Officers and Designated Senior Officers to plan and undertake Enquiries, understanding their key role and responsibility within the multi-agency context;
- To be familiar with the key stages and decision points;
- Improved skill in conducting, recording and managing Enquiries;
- Familiarity with principles and practice of effective communication with key stakeholders, and accountability for decision-making;
- Evaluation of evidence;
- Effective post Enquiry action planning.
