However, if one is not received, the Governors will not be able to apply their admissions criteria, and the application will be considered as a lower priority. The Supplementary Information Form should be returned directly to the School. Children in Local Authority Care or Previously in Local Authority Care a 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangements, or special guardianship order. When we apply the distance criterion for the school, these straight line measurements are used to determine how close each applicant's address is to the school. Where two or more children have an otherwise equal priority under the oversubscription criteria random selection will be used to establish which is ranked ahead of the other.

Notes:

An applicant applying under criterion 2 will be one whose family attends at least monthly. The worshipper may be the child for whom application is made or one or both parents/grandparents/guardians.

A waiting list will be held for at least the first term of the academic year in oversubscription criteria order and will be re-ranked each time a child is added or before an offer is made.

Requests for admission to Year 7 outside of the normal age group should be made to the Headteacher of each preferred school as early as possible in the admissions round associated with that child's date of birth. This will allow the school and admissions authority sufficient time to make a decision before the closing date. Parents are not expected to provide evidence to support their request to defer their application, however where provided it must be specific to the child in question. This might include medical or Educational Psychologist reports. There is no legal requirement for this medical or educational evidence to be secured from an appropriate professional, however, failure to provide this may impede a school's ability to agree to deferral. This application can be cancelled if the school agrees to accept a deferred application for entry into year 7 the following year. Arrangements for admission to Post-16 Provision

The minimum entrance requirements for the Sixth Form and for the range of courses available are based upon GCSE grades or other measures of prior attainment. To gain entry to the Sixth Form applicants will need to have achieved:

- Grade 4 or better in Mathematics
- Grade 4 or better in either English Literature or English Language
- At least 5 grade 9 5 in GCSE or equivalent subjects
- The specific entry requirements for each A level that the applicant wishes to study. These are published on the school's website and are available directly from the school.

These criteria are the same for internal and external transfers. All internal applicants who meet the criteria will be admitted to the Sixth Form, even if this number is greater than the planned admissions number. The entry criteria will be published in the autumn immediately preceding the year of admissions (that is autumn 2019) for September 2020 admissions. The criteria will be included within the Sixth Form prospectus and on the school website. If 120 or more students from within Saint George's School meet the admissions criteria and wish to enter year 12 of the Sixth Form, no external applicants will be considered.

Successful applicants will be offered a conditional place that is dependent on them attaining the entry criteria in the actual GCSE exams. Numbers are limited in subjects and where this number has been met alternative subjects may be offered.
